

Rules for Monthly Fishing Competitions

- 1/ No boundaries apply to where you can fish, but they must be caught within Australian Territorial waters
 - 2/ You can use whatever bait, Lures etc you want, to catch your fish as long it is of legal means and is in accordance with the ANSA Guidelines.
 - 3/ All fish must be of legal length to count for the comp as set out by the ANSA National Guidelines. Points to be awarded as per our Normal formula. [(Factor x Weight / Line Class) x 100]
 - 4/ The winner of the Monthly Comp is the person who accumulates the most number of points for the month.
 - 5/ You must attend the BBQ / Weigh In to register your catch for the Comp. Photo's are accepted and weights taken must be on scales registered with, and tested by, the Club Weighmaster, and be done in accordance with ANSA Guidelines.
- In certain situations where you may not be able to attend the Weigh in, you can lodge a request with the Management Committee for your fish to be accepted for the Weigh In. You would need to outline the circumstances of why you cannot attend. It will then be up to the Management Committee to decide if your fish will be accepted at the Weigh In.
- 6/ The colour for each month will be chosen by a member selected randomly by the Management Committee at the monthly meeting before the start of each comp. You MUST have this colour in any photo's you submit for the comp.
 - 7/ If fishing without a witness photo's must have the fish on an acceptable measuring device with stopper, with the head of the fish to the stopper. Only one fish to be on the Accepted Measuring Device at a time in the photos. If fishing with a witness, a normal portrait style photo of the angler and fish is acceptable.
 - 8/ You can weigh in a maximum of 5 Fish with a maximum of 2 fish per species. They do not have to be target species.
 - 9/ For those Members who live outside the Wide Bay Region, or who can't make the Weigh In as per Rule 5 above, if you submit a Photo of a particular species for the Monthly Comp BEFORE the BBQ / Weigh In, and then catch another two of the same species that are Bigger, your first fish will be counted plus one of the other two you have caught. Please be aware of this if you decide to send in photo's before the Weigh In. All photo's are to be submitted to the Club Recorder.
 - 10/ Any disputes will have to be lodge to the Management Committee and their decision will be final.
 - 11/ The winner is the person at the end of the comp who has the highest accumulated points worked out by our Normal Formula, second is the person with the next highest accumulated points and third is the person with the third highest accumulated points.

Points to go towards Junior and Senior Club Champion are worked as follows:

Points are awarded as 4 points for the winner, 3 points for second, 2 points for third and everyone that weighs in gets 1 point.
